PARKING LOT KINDNESS

Dropping off and picking up your student from school in the parking lot is always a practice of patience. We encourage all drivers to pull forward along the sidewalk beyond the canopy walkway. SPRING TIME DRESS CODE REMINDER

Maywood has a dress code to help establish an expectation of modest and appropriate attire in school. This helps our students focus on learning. As spring weather arrives, please help your student adhere to the dress code by checking that any shirts have straps at least three fingers wide, shorts or skirts reach the lower edge of the student's fingertips when hands are dropped to the sides, and that mid-riffs and undergarments are covered. You can refer to the Student Handbook (p. 9 inside the student planner) for the entire dress code. Students will be asked to change if not wearing appropriate clothing. Working together, we can build upon our community beliefs of respect and integrity.
