PRELIMINARY RESULTS OF THE OFFICE OF THE EDUCATION OMBUDS FAMILY ENGAGEMENT SURVEY

Families were presented with 26 values that came from common family engagement activities. They identified the following top 5 values as important to them in how schools engage with families.

- 1. Make sure that there is effective two-way communication (school to family; family to school) about what is happening at the school and with students.
- 2. Work to build authentic relationships between families and educators.
- 3. Help families understand and be confident about how schools and processes work.
- 4. Build a welcoming and culturally responsive school climate.
- 5. Respect and honor racial, ethnic, cultural, language, ability, belief, or other identities in working with families and students.
